CYBER SAFETY TIPS-HOW TO MANAGE YOUR DIGITAL FOOTPRINT AND ONLINE SAFETY

With society becoming increasingly involved in social networking information and communication technology it is important that we remember that we use these information communication technologies responsibly. One of the great things about being online is the ability to share videos and photos with your friends and seeing their response. When using devices it is always best that this is done under parental supervision.

It is important to remember that everything you post online combines to make your digital footprint. Remember that what is shared by you with your friends can also be viewed by people you don't know. And once it's online, it could be there forever. As part of our cyber safety lessons in Personal Development we

support our students to learn about the risks of playing online games, participating in online chat groups and sharing personal information online.

We encourage our students to manage their digital footprint by:

- Keeping personal details private
- Not sharing usernames or passwords with anyone.
- Thinking before posting. Once posted, it can be difficult to remove.
- Not posting things that you don't want others to know about or that you wouldn't say to their face.
- Being respectful of other people's content that you post and share. Only post photos of others if you have their permission.
- Report immediately to family or trusted adults if something makes you uncomfortable, scared or sad.
 Or call the Kids Helpline 1800 55 1800 number to talk to an expert.

Most social networking sites such as Facebook and Instagram have a minimum age limit of 13 and are therefore not appropriate for primary school students.

Student Absences

If your child will be absent from school please email their teacher and include the school office email brookvale-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au with the reason of absence. Alternatively, through the current enews app you can select digital forms and complete an Absentee Form which will notify the school directly. Please note that if your child is sick for three consecutive days you will need to supply a medical certificate for their absence to the front office upon returning to school.

Schools continue to be safe, and operations are in line with Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC) and NSW Health advice. All students should be learning on campus unless they are unwell or have a medical certificate to support their absence.

In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded **NOT** to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms. Schools will make arrangements for students who present as unwell or have flu like symptoms to be sent home.

NSW Health have requested that schools encourage anyone who is unwell or has even **mild flu-like symptoms**, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 clinics. Our local clinic is at Northern Beaches Hospital and the Community Health Centre at Brookvale bus stop.

Students with flu like symptoms will need to provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result before being permitted to return to school.

Placement at NBSC Manly Campus is based on a student's performance in the NSW Selective Schools Test.

General Achievement Test Information and Application Process

Dear Parents/Caregivers and Year 7 2022 Students

On **Thursday 18 March 2021** a General Achievement Test will be offered for students to be considered for selection in the Year 7 2022 Academic Extension Classes at NBSC Cromer Campus.

NBSC Cromer Campus is an active member of the Peninsula Community of Schools (PCS), the Northern Beaches Secondary College (NBSC) and the Northern Beaches Learning Alliance (NBLA).

Students are eligible for placement in the Academic Extension Class at their local designated secondary school (Refer to *NSW Public School Finder* to confirm your designated local school).

General Achievement Test

The General Achievement Test is a two hour externally sourced test focusing on English, Mathematics and Science skills. The format is:

- Reading and Language (40 minutes) 40 multiple choice questions from stimulus material
- Mathematics (40 minutes) 40 multiple choice questions
- Writing task (30 minutes) 1 writing task

A fee of \$45 covers the cost of external marking, administration, test supervision and materials.

Examination Procedures

The test will be held at NBSC Cromer Campus.

The test begins at 9:15am sharp in the school hall of **NBSC Cromer Campus**. Please ensure students report to the hall by 9:05am.

At 11:30am the test will conclude. Please collect students immediately following the test as supervision will not be provided.

School Selection Criteria

- 1. Any Year 6 PCS/NBLA primary school student can sit the General Achievement Test.
- 2. PCS/NBSC secondary schools will offer Academic Extension Class positions only to successful in-area students.

School Selection Process

Following receipt of test results the PCS/NBSC secondary school principals will offer placement to the highest ranked students for the Academic Extension Class at their school. A reserve list will also be established.

General Achievement Application Form

Applications must be received, no later than **Friday 19 February 2021**. Applications will only be processed with a valid payment via POP – Parent Online Payment, cash or cheque payable to NBSC Cromer Campus enclosed with the completed application form.

A confirmation email will be sent by Friday 6 March 2021.

Admission to the test hall on test day

Only registered students will be allowed to sit the test.
